

RABBI'S MESSAGE: OY, THE ECONOMY

Most of us with 401k's, IRAs and retirement savings are a bit poorer this year. Based on my discussion, those who were conservatively invested, they are down between 15 and 25%; those a bit more aggressively invested are feeling the pain at the 35 to 45% level. As far as I know, no one at Betenu was directly impacted by the Madoff scandal, but to the extent that "*kol Yis-ra-eil a-ra-vim z eve-zeh* (all Jews are intertwined, one with the other), the scandal does serve to enhance some anti-Semitic myths and libels.

Many Jewish organizations are serious hurting. The JFNH campaign came up very short with the last number I saw showing a 35% shortfall from the campaign target. Many smaller Jewish organizations that have overlapping functions are looking to consolidate in hopes of finding an economy of scale – or in some cases: just survival.

I wish I could say that Betenu has been exempt from all of this, but the Treasurer's reports at the monthly board meetings are pretty gloomy and a major subject of the last several board meetings has been: what can we do to cut costs?

I wish I had a magic answer for us or anyone else for that matter. So here is the truth. Judaism and most synagogues survived the Great Depression. Even for our oldest members, the Great Depression is only a collection of stories we read about in a history book or perhaps heard about from parents who experienced it. So for the majority of us, we are in uncharted territory.

Nobel Laureates in economics, as well as many others, have done a great deal of research on the Great Depression. Their research has yielded a clear cut picture of things that definitely didn't work. Will the Obama stimulus package work? I have no idea, and neither do any of the so-called experts. What is true is that the administration seems to be sensitive to not repeating the old mistakes and is committed to the idea that even plowing ahead with a potentially wrong solution is superior to doing nothing. I can't imagine there is anyone who honestly wants to see this plan fail.

But regardless of the outcome, my message to you with respect to Betenu is simple:

If you lost your job and are hurting, please do not resign your membership. We will work with you; we will find you an abatement. Abatements are completely confidential. To get one, you can ask me; the President, David Spokane; or the Treasurer, Joel Silberberg.

AND

If you are among the majority who are still working, please consider a supplemental donation.

Together, we will get through what is - and will continue to be - a very difficult time.
