Last month, there was unemployment, a war in Iraq, a war in Afghanistan, a crisis in health care and the list continues. And yet, as I watched the news, I saw endless coverage of a drunk who fell in front of a subway, the Amanda Knox trial, Tiger Woods' infidelity, etc.

There is more outrage about insignificant things than there are about the millions ignored by our health care system, the foreclosures and the bodies of deceased Americans returning from Asia.

There seems to be an analogy here with the Middle Ages. How did they keep the peasants in line? It wasn't the incompetence of the government. Let's distract the population by blaming it on someone else and we Jews became a convenient someone else.

Collectively, our news media are ignoring or at minimum downplaying the real issues. It's bad enough that we are wasting the news times from the issues about which there should be outrage to obsessing about Tiger Woods.






