Subject: Stepping Up to 5773

From time-to-time over my nearly 30 years at Betenu, I've talked about the process of replacing me. Usually, that talk was followed by a question from congregants, "Are you OK?" or ""Do you know something we don't?" All I know are the words of Ecclesiastes 1:4, "One generation passes away, and another generation comes: but the earth abides forever." And my generation is in fact passing into retirement.

The neat thing is, with a little luck and a little planning, we all reach a point in life where we can reap the rewards of a long career. I come from poverty and have worked since I got a newspaper delivery route in 1957. When I retired from my 34 year tech career in 2007, people asked me, "What will you do now that you are retired?" My answer was, "Retired? I have my pulpit, my skiing and my cemetery work." And since then, I've picked up "park volunteer" as head of the Mine Falls Park Advisory Committee.

But there is a difference. When I left the MITRE Corporation in 2007, I knew that I would probably never participate in technology development and the doctorate I earned in 1973 was no longer relevant to my future. In retiring from Betenu, I anticipate a continued relationship with Betenu as "rabbi emeritus" and a continued use of my rabbinic education with my writings and miscellaneous freelance opportunities. To put it in Buberian perspective, technology was an I-it relationship. Betenu has been I-thou.

The board has already voted to retain a successor starting when I finish in December of this year. (I will leave it to the Board to announce him formally.) For those worried whether Betenu would continue to provide Reform Judaism to the greater Nashua area, please stay with us and check out the future.

Betenu needs fiscal support to pay bills, but what we need more of: your involvement to make the programs, services and school work. So contact the Executive Board (execs@betenu.org) and just as together, we made it work for the last 29 years,

now together, you will make it work for the foreseeable future.



HIGH HOLIDAYS PARKING

Please respect and follow these important parking rules:

- ★ The roadway behind Betenu is a FIRE LANE. Parking behind Betenu is prohibited.
- ★ The three legal spaces on the side of the building are reserved for the Rabbi, the Cantorial Soloist, and the President (or the highest bidder). Please respect this.
- ★ The five legal spaces directly in front of Betenu's front door are reserved for handicapped access. Please respect this.
- ⋄ For evening or weekend services, parking is available in the condo lot.
- ★ For weekday services, parking is NOT available in the condo lot.
- It is a workday and the offices all use the parking lot. Please park on Northern Blvd or on Columbia Drive on the side of the street closest to Betenu. Only handicapped parking is available!
- ❖ You may also park in far end of the Wal-Mart lot (closest to Betenu).

IN THE INTEREST OF HAVING EVERYONE GAIN THE MOST MEANING FROM OUR SERVICES, PLEASE FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES:

Please bring your admission letters with you to ALL services this will exepedite entrance. For those people without letter, there will be another line where you will be required to fill out information, show identification, and make financial arrangements.

Members have preferential seating in the sanctuary up until 15 minutes before each service begins.

When taking your seat, please move all the way to the end of the row. DO NOT leave seats empty in the middle of the row. This way there will be room for all.

Parents with children in the babysitting room should sit upstairs so you can be easily found if you are needed.

Remember the solemnity of the Kol Nidre and Yizkor services on Yom Kippur. Parents should use their best judgment to determine whether their children can sit quietly for these services. Otherwise, parents may be asked to take their children upstairs to the Kindergarten room.

Babysitting will be available during the morning services on both Rosh HaShana and Yom Kippur in the Kindergarten room.
